COUNTRYSIDE BREAKFAST MARCH 15, 2023



CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Christian Education is kicking off the new year with a book study helping us understand the heart of Jesus with Dane C. Ortlund's book, <u>Gentle and Lowly: The Heart of Christ for Sinners and Sufferers</u>. We are taking a deeper look into what comes naturally to Jesus and how these aspects can become natural to us as Christians. We meet on Thursday afternoons at 3:30 in the choir room.

We are doing something a little different for our Lenten Study this year! Brian McNally will present "CORONATION – The story and study of the Passion of Christ." The class will be taught over a six week period during the Lenten Season. The "Coronation" is a teacher/student study of the events described in the Bible that end in the Passion and Death of Jesus on the cross and the absolute victory proclaimed at his resurrection. The classes will begin March 6 and conclude on Easter Monday, April 10. Classes will start at 2:15. Stay tuned for location and further information from Brian!

Along with Brian's study, a new fellowship and Bible study group will also begin during Lent this year. The group, "Come to the Table," will gather at Tari and Dale Ambler's house in On Top of the World beginning on Monday, February 20 from 5:30-7:30 p.m. We will start each gathering in fellowship over a light meal (soups, casseroles, etc.) and follow this time with a variety of Bible study topics led by Dale. Our first study will be, "24 Hours that Changed the World," by Adam Hamilton looking at the last 24 hours of Jesus' earthly life and its significance for all who choose to believe. Because this will be an in-home group, Tari and Dale will be limiting the group to 12 including themselves and using a first come/first served basis to fill the group by responding to Dale's email for those who are interested: <u>DFAPURDUE81@gmail.com</u>.

The next book our Monday Book Club is reading will be *Uniquely Stella*, by Deborah M. Menenberg. It's a post WWII book about a 19-year-old former war factory worker who embarks on a journey of unexpected consequences. After meeting a young black woman on a train heading west, they uncover the complexities and depth of discrimination and prejudice. Lessons that go on to fuel Stella's poignant and powerful journey that in fact begin with the birth of her Down's syndrome daughter. Inspired by a true story, *Uniquely Stella* combines love, humor, and grace into a tale reminding us that the policies and laws governing us should always be guided by a passion for equality. We will read the first 200 pages for February 27 and finish the book for March. Book Club meets the 4th Monday of every month at 2:00 in the Choir Room.

While our library is still in reorganization mode, we have placed three books on the Visitors Table for you to enjoy! These books are **In the Footsteps of the Master**: a book that follows the footsteps of Jesus with contemporary photographs and maps of the Holy Land along with inspiring text, **Who's Who in the Bible**: a biographical dictionary of people from the Bible, and **A Daybook of Prayer**: including meditations, scriptures, and prayers to draw nearer to the Heart of God.
