period she was a board member for the Georgia Veteran's Day Parade Assn. - 3 of those years as Executive Director. Quite an honor was bestowed upon her as she was named "Outstanding Citizen of Georgia" by the General Assembly in 1994 and "Outstanding Ambassador of Georgia" by Secretary of State, Max Clelland. Noting all of the above, is it any wonder that she was elected to her high school "Hall of Fame" in 1991?

In JoAnn's own words she says, "Belonging to Countryside Presbyterian Church is such a joyl It has and continues to be such a privilege to serve here. I call it my Music Ministry for my "Master". How blessed I am to have found this dear church and all the wonderful and loving people in it". It goes without saying that we are fortunate to have this energetic, pleasant lady in our church. Be sure to say "Hello!" (if you can catch her as she buzzes by) and thank her for giving so much of her time and talent to Countryside
