NOMINATING COMMITTEE

Section G-2.0401in The BOOK OF ORDER mandates the makeup of the Nominating Committee.

"Ruling elders and deacons are men and women elected by the congregation from among its members. The nomination and election of ruling elders and deacons shall express the rich diversity of the congregation's membership and shall guarantee participation and inclusiveness (F-1.0403). Ruling elders and deacons shall be nominated by a committee elected by the congregation, drawn from and representative of its membership. **Congregations may provide by their own rule for a congregational nominating committee.** The rule shall meet the following criteria: (1) the minimum size of the committee as serving specified in the rule shall be at least three persons; (2) at least one member of the committee shall be an elder serving on session; and (3) a majority of those persons on the committee who are eligible to vote shall consist of persons not currently serving on session. The pastor shall serve as ex-officio and without vote. When elections are held, full opportunity shall always be given to the congregation for nomination from the floor of the congregational meeting by any active member of the congregation. A majority of all the active members present and voting shall be required to elect."

The bold face print above is as it appears in the BOOK OF ORDER. Countryside Presbyterian has historically used the second and simpler method in establishing the nominating committee. It was the accepted method and I used it for the nine years that I have served as the Nominating Chair. It was easier to replace a committee member who, for some reason, could not continue to serve. Each year a committee was established.

Pastor Rhonda has suggested to me that we should change our method and have the nominating committee members elected by the congregation annually at the January congregational meeting. After a lot of thought and prayer I have come to see the benefit of having the congregation fully involved in all our election processes. We will continue to have three serving session members and four members from the congregation. Elders not currently serving on session are eligible for election to the nominating committee.

Forms will be placed in the Sunday bulletin on December 3 and 10 for all active members of the church to suggest church members to serve on the nominating committee.

Contribute to Countryside and Save on Your Taxes

There seem to be few win-win situations these days, but if you have an IRA, 401(k), 403(b) or other tax advantaged account there is one that can benefit both you and Countryside. Since the change in the tax laws several years ago which increased the standard deduction, most likely many of us no longer itemize our deductions when figuring our federal income tax. Thus, we are no longer able to deduct any contributions from our income to reduce our federal tax burden. I would imagine also that many of us are required each year to take a Required Minimum Distribution or RMD from any IRA, 401(k), 403(b) or other tax advantaged accounts that we have and must therefore pay income tax on this distribution. Or alternatively, we may take distributions from our plans on a yearly basis on which we must pay taxes.

However, the IRS gives us one glimmer of help. Basically, if you contribute <u>directly</u> from an IRA, 401(k), 403(b) or certain other tax advantaged account to Countryside Presbyterian Church you may do so without adding the amount of the donation to your taxable income. This is called a "**Qualified Charitable Distribution**" or **QCD.** The contribution must be sent <u>directly</u> from your plan administrator, such as Schwab, Fidelity, or Vanguard, to Countryside; the funds <u>cannot pass through you</u> before making your contribution.

So, rather than paying taxes on all your required minimum distribution or any other distribution you may take, you can donate all or a portion of your RMD or distribution to Countryside and not have to pay any taxes on that amount. For example, if your distribution for 2023 is \$2,000 and you have half of it, or \$1,000, sent directly to Countryside from your account, then rather than adding \$2,000 to your income to be taxed, you would only be taxed on the \$1,000 you keep. Thus, you may increase your contribution to Countryside for no additional expense to you when considering taxes. A benefit to both you and to Countryside Presbyterian Church of Ocala, Inc. (our official name for tax purposes).

This is just a quick summary and of course the IRS has certain requirements that must be met. Therefore, <u>please</u> contact your retirement plan administrator or financial advisor for specific information and requirements before making a QCD. And as always, thank you for your support of our Church.
