In addition, on this first Sunday of the month we will carry out the Ordination and Installation of Ruling Elders comprising the Class of 2026 on Session.

As the month progresses, we can expect a feeling of anticipation to grow as we approach Reformation Sunday which comes on October 29. As is our tradition, we will celebrate this day of worship with bagpipes preluding the Kirking of the Tartans, reflecting our historical church heritage.

This time of year, we start to see higher attendance as many people return from summer getaways. It's a time when we look forward to inviting new friends to church, too, as so many are moving into our newer nearby neighborhoods.

We invite anybody not yet involved to consider helping in our Sunday worship volunteering. Our various tasks just take a little bit of learning and are an uplifting part of coming to church on Sunday. Feel free to approach any of our greeters, ushers, A.V. people, helpers preparing the sanctuary or communion table, folks doing clean-up after worship, or others to ask about helping with our worship and music ministries.

Music rehearsals are back on schedule each Wednesday – Bell Choir at 1:30 p.m., Praise Team at 3:00 p.m., and Chancel Choir at 3:30 p.m. The Chancel Choir is rehearsing anthems for our 10:30 worship service as well as a Christmas Cantata, "A Child, a King: Celebrating the Son of the Father's Love" by Marty Parks, scheduled for Sunday, December 10.

Anybody who would like to join in ringing or singing, please see Raúl in the choir room before or after Sunday worship service, or on Wednesdays at or before rehearsal times. Anybody who would like to join in the singing of the Christmas Cantata are welcome to rehearse with the Chancel Choir even if you are not part of the choir's weekly music offerings.

Our early service is going strong and has proven to offer a special appeal for both long-time members and new members and visitors. This service starts at 9:00 a.m. each Sunday and typically runs 45 minutes including communion. Music books and screen-projected lyrics are offered for worshippers to sing a variety of contemporary Christian songs. Early arrivals are welcome.
