We Remember Fenton Overly





A Resident of Note

Fenton George Overly

"Okay," the order was, "snap it" and the Army Air Force photographer caught the essence of Mount Fujiyama, the Japanese icon, flying in a Gooney Bird (DC-3) during an initial surveillance flight which included pictures of the destruction of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. Flight Officer Fenton Overly was pilot-in-command in the left seat. Overly was the last of the "flying sergeants"

His next assignment in 1945 was flying air, sea and rescue operations at the controls of a Catalina flying boat or a C-46 or even another Gooney Bird whose bomb bays contained small boats. "We had a B-17 with a boat attached to the bomb bay and would drop this to stranded personnel in the water," explains Overly.

Flight Officer Overly was directly involved in transporting our American prisoners of war (POW) from the prison camp in Fukuoka to Manila hospital ships for medical treatment. "The condition of the POWs was deplorable," describes Overly.

Each JC-47 he flew carried 60 litter patients; the larger C-47 would carry 120 litters. "We were instructed not to shoot the Japanese prison guards – still a mystery to me 68 years later." The author of this article wisited many of these camps in September 1945 and can concur with Flight Officer Overly's assessment.


Before conscription, Overly worked as an aeronautical engineer at Ford, testing engines, from 1938 to 1941, during which time he purchased a Piper Club for \$945. He learned to fly and received a pilot's license in two weeks. He was then inducted into the Army Air Corps where he was sent to non-commissioned officers flight school in Greensboro, N.C. and became proficient as a flying sergeant due to the paucity of commissioned pilots. He became familiar with the L-5 observation plane while sationed in Ft. Wayne, which served as a stepping-stone for the left seat of the B-24 (four engines), thence to navigation school.

Overly then flew and delivered all types of planes to the services throughout the United States.

Overly flew the L-5 with cameraman over the invasion of Okinawa as well as Ie Shima from which the first contour maps were fashioned for the ground forces. He observed the troops under combat conditions causing this writer to wonder if Overly was flying and mapping the area while he was eating sand. Typical of all islands attacked by Allied Forces in the SW Pacific, accurate mapping was highly inadequate, thus Overly's successful assignments invariably saved many lives.

Upon being released from the service in 1946, he reverted to his staff sergeant rank and joined General Motors for whom he worked for 30 years as manager of technical service zones specializing in the Buick. He moved to On Top of the World in 1985, confounded Countryside Presbyterian Church and founded and staffed the Alzheimer's Club of Ocala with the writer helping as counselor.

Fenton Overly participated in the Ocala Honor Flight in 2010 and found the occasion rewarding.

Fenton and Dorothy Overly were long time members of Countryside. Both Fenton and Dorothy died in 2012. Fenton, as well as being an Elder and cofounder of CPC, was also at one time President of the Corporation of Countryside Presbyterian Church. Their many gifts and contributions to CPC over the years were greatly appreciated.

Our weekly observance of Communion at the 9:00 service continues as it has been, and Communion is offered on the first Sunday of each month at the 10:30 service. We follow the method of Intinction in serving the elements, and offer pre-packaged elements plus gluten-free bread at the 10:30 service for those who prefer either option.
