All the Session Elders I worked with: Most all were so caring and interested in doing the best for the church. I enjoyed knowing all of you and was very impressed by your service.


Building & Grounds—WOW! Thank you for all the help. I couldn't have done it without you.

The Central Florida Master Choir was in top form for the concert on April 21. They just keep getting better. An audience of approximately 470 was exuberant in their response to the music. The first half of the concert was a very challenging composition from Franz Schubert, Mass No. 3 in B-Flat Major, sung in its original German. The New Moon String Ensemble added to

the richness of voices to produce an impressive performance. Pianist GayLyn Capitano performed a moving, very difficult Bach composition to conclude the first half.

The second half presented whimsy and contemporary pieces, including Aaron Copland, Argentine tango, black spirituals, a Dr. McSwain arrangement of *Amazing Grace* that was unlike any other versions one may have heard, and concluded with Irving Berlin's I'll Be Seeing You.

We hope all will be at Countryside on May 5, 3:00 P.M. for a long-awaited concert from our Music Director, Raúl Ramírez Lugo, who will present a concert with member John Goulet. Raúl will play assorted numbers and John will entertain with easy listening music from such artists as Sinatra, Dean Martin, Bobby Darin, Englebert and many more.

As always, a great big thanks to John Bain and John Berry who do set ups for concerts and ushers who hand out programs and greet people and also collect offerings. Join us for an afternoon of fun, food, games and fellowship at the Annual Spring Picnic on May 18.


Table Games, Bingo, Bean Bag Toss, Horseshoes, Frisbee Golf and maybe even a sing-along.
