Sunday Afternoon Concerts are Back!

Grace Dunlevy, chairman of Countryside Presbyterian Church Concerts, announces that our first musical concert will be on **October 13, 2024** when the **Southland Dixie Stompers** kick off our 2024-2025 concert season. The Southland Dixie consist of six Village residents who grew up listening to and playing Dixieland jazz throughout their lives. They joined forces to create The Southland Dixie Stompers after the musicians retired and moved to The Villages. The origins of The Stompers materialized when Rod Jacobs asked Lew Buckley, during a jazz workshop rehearsal, if he had any interest in traditional jazz. "I laughed," said Buckley. "I had been missing playing that music." Everyone they asked was interested and was willing to form the band. A vocalist, Dodie Fisher, has recently joined the group.

A second concert will follow on October 27th. Originally founded in March 1990, the Kingdom of the Sun Concert Band is an all-volunteer organization and longtime community band. The band rehearses every Monday evening. Their repertoire offers a wide variety of music including marches, big band medleys, classical, popular music, show tunes and patriotic tributes. The band performs throughout the year at venues in the greater Ocala/Marion County area.

The Countryside Luncheon for September

Our September Luncheon featured Karla Grimsley-Greenway, the Chief Executive Officer of Interfaith Emergency Services. Ms. Grimsley-Greenway spoke of how the services at Interfaith have grown over the years, from an agency that started out predominantly feeding the needy that has now grown into an agency that offers a "hand up" not a "hand out".

Among the services now offered:

- Food Pantry
- Sheltered housing for homeless women and children
- A boutique that dresses men and women for job interviews
- The Food for Kids Backpack program which supplies food for Homeless children who normally get their meals at school but no meals on weekends. The Backpack Program fills in this need on the weekends when they are not in school.
- Shower ministry that allows homeless people to take showers.
- A program that helps people get ID's that have been stolen so they can get back into the workforce (she told us that all homeless at one time or another have their ID's stolen)
- Counseling
- Programs that get people back into the workforce and ultimately back into housing.
- A medical division that helps people get their needed medications.

They have also branched out and have bought and rehabbed an apartment building to give people affordable housing that have gone through their programs. This list is not inclusive, but you can see how they have grown and serve the community with the help of local churches and their ministries which started this agency.

Miss Grimsley-Greenwood was so interesting and gave us such a good feeling about how our donations are benefiting so many.
