Your July/August Mission Results:

In July, your contribution of Rice and Beans collected = 252 items!

As of August 18th, the collection of Ramen Noodles and Applesauce = 587!!!

Backpack foods = 37 items

Interfaith extra foods and personal items = 10 items

Crafty Christians completed 62 items for our local charities

We recently had a drive for school supplies.

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


